

Reintegrating into the Communities of Clallam County

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You've been released, now what?

Re-entering the community after incarceration can be challenging, but planning for it should help make it easier. This booklet was put together so you know where to go for housing, starting or restarting your government benefits, and finding other resources to ensure you have your basic needs met that are available; this may even include obtaining personal identification.

There are many important steps you must take once you have been released. Use this guide to help you reintegrate into the Port Angeles, Sequim, or Forks communities.

Step 1: Healthcare

If you had Medicaid healthcare, your benefits were terminated while you were in jail. Once you are released, it takes at least 24 hours, if not longer, to be reinstated.

If you are released and need medications before the suspension is lifted, you can visit the nearest DSHS office:

You can also come to Peninsula Behavioral Health and speak with a Community Assister Volunteer who can help speed up the process.

****If you were prescribed medications while in jail, you will only have a limited refill when released (typically 30 days). Therefore, you will need to immediately obtain (or reconnect with) a doctor in your community. If you were released with a prescription for a psychiatric medication, you should connect with your local community mental health center to obtain refills for these medications. The agencies below will help you**

get enrolled into the programs that best suit your needs and help you with the next steps you need to take.

Step 2: Identification

Proof of identity is required in order to receive many services. Your social security card and an ID card will usually be enough. However, if you don't have these documents, you will need your birth certificate in order to apply for them.

In order to get your birth certificate, you need to provide your full name, birthdate and place of birth.

Certificates cost \$20 each and are payable by cash (exact change required), check, or money order made out to Clallam County Health & Human Services (CCHHS). No credit/debit cards accepted.
