OCH leads integration and coordination efforts by bringing partners together to explore areas of continued need and identify and implement creative solutions. <p><b>Reduced substance misuse and addiction</b></p>	<p>Emphasis placed on primary prevention and coordinating region-wide standards of care, ultimately reducing unhealthy use of all substances. Focus on reducing stigma and ensuring broad access to appropriate and preferred treatment options. OCH serves in a lead role, expanding on initial successes with the 3CCORP model to include additional substances such as alcohol.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Address addiction stigma (work starting in 2021) through a multi-pronged approach including training, advocacy, communications, etc.</li> <li>• Support a region-wide health information exchange platform with closed-loop referral and bi-directional communication</li> </ul>
