


Virtual Norms




Land Acknowledgement

The Hoh, Quileute, Makah, Lower Elwha Klallam, Jamestown S'Klallam, Port Gamble S'Klallam, and Suquamish.

Clallam Successes

- Port Angeles Community Paramedicine Program works with Jim's Pharmacy and Volunteer Hospice of Clallam County to safely and conveniently provide flu shots and COVID tests for homebound hospice patients.
- On giving Tuesday, instead of asking for money, OPHCC hand delivered jars to local BH providers in Clallam. Jars included encouraging quotes and messages of inspiration and local gift cards.
- The Hi•dasubač Program at Sophie Trettevick Indian Health Center coordinated with Neah Bay Schools and Makah Employment and Training to launch an online internship for Makah high school students. The interns met three times a week, learning leadership skills based on Indigenous values and applied learnings to tribal food sovereignty.











Regional Successes



OCH received full DSRIP earnings to pass along to partners. \$11,255,352 paid directly to partners 2018-20. An additional \$1,255,390 in targeted investments to support partners.

22 submissions in the student poster contest, "Plant Hope, Grow Resilience", encouraging resilience during COVID-19 through art and creativity.

12% increase in preventative and restorative dental services between Jan 2017 and Dec 2019 (all ages).

16,790 participants in chronic disease programs across community-based partners.

78% of Medicaid Managed Care contacts in the Olympic region were in **value-based payment arrangements** (16% increase from 2019).



As of 3/6/2021, Clallam County: 42,812 doses given




WA State Vaccination Coverage by





